

UNNECESSARY NOISES ORDINANCE

Preamble

The Board of Trustees of the Village of Aurora, County of Cayuga and State of New York, pursuant to the provisions of the Village Law of the State of New York does on the 4 th day of February , 1970, hereby enact the following ordinance for the good order, peace, health, safety and welfare of its inhabitants with relation to unnecessary noises within the corporate limits of the Village of Aurora.

Unnecessary Noises

It shall be unlawful for any person to make, continue or cause to be made or continued any unnecessary or unusual noise which either annoys, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health or safety of others, whether in the operation of any machine or vehicle or the exercise of any trade or calling or otherwise unless the making and continuing of the same be necessary for the protection or preservation of property or of the health, safety, life or limb of some person.

PENALTY -- Any violation of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of not exceeding \$250.00 for any offense. In addition, a violation of this ordinance shall constitute disorderly conduct, and a person violating the same shall be a disorderly person.

CONSTITUTIONALITY -- If any part or parts of this ordinance are for any reason held to be invalid, such decision shall not effect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

TIME TO TAKE EFFECT -- This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and the necessary compliance with the law of the State of New York relating to publication and posting.
