Miscellaneous

Cayuga Lake Watershed Intermunicipal Organization (CWIO): Elizabeth Thomas, chair of the committee, gave a presentation to the Town of Ledyard highlighting the new funding formula for municipalities.

The group submitted a grant application to the Park Foundation requesting funding for a watershed manager.

Old Business

Comp Plan Steering Committee: the committee will hold a public hearing to receive comments on the Draft Plan, possibly via Zoom. Trustee Bates suggested having the hearing in person, in a bigger space than the firehouse meeting room.

Water Update: The Cayuga County Health Department (CCDOH) granted the Village a 60-day extension to solve the water pressure problem at the Inns of Aurora Spa. Mayor Bennett and Village Engineer, Ken Teter, met with Inns of Aurora representatives and discussed a plan to build a new water tank on Sherwood, paid for by the Inns of Aurora. Mayor Bennett notified Eileen O'Conner from CCDOH and is waiting on her response. If CCDOH approves the plan, the next step is to draft a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Village Board of Trustees and the Inns of Aurora.

Court Street: Trustee Murphy inquired on the status of traffic calming options for Court St now that the Inns of Aurora Taylor House/parking lot project is complete. Trustee Orman echoed Trustee Murphy's concerns regarding the increase in traffic and speed on Court St despite a posted 15 mph limit. Trustees Bates, Murphy, and Orman are all Court St residents. Mayor Bennett responded that the Village DPW is researching cost estimates for permanent speed bumps.

Introduction to Local Law #4 of 2021:

VILLAGE OF AURORA RESOLUTION #21-25
INTRODUCING LOCAL LAW #4 OF 2021 ENTITLED
"A LOCAL LAW TO EXTEND A TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON NON- RESIDENTIAL PERMIT APPLICATIONS

Introduced by: Trustee Bianconi Seconded by: Trustee Bates Dated: October 20, 2021

WHEREAS, the Village of Aurora Board of Trustees ("Village Board") has found that it is necessary and prudent to adopt a new local law extending a moratorium on non-residential permit applications for the purposes of allowing additional time for the Village to update its zoning laws; and

WHEREAS, this proposed Local Law is a "Type II" action and is not an action reasonably anticipated to "affect the environment" pursuant to 6 NYCRR §617.5(c)(30) of the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQR), and thus is exempt from environmental review thereunder; and

WHEREAS, this action involves the adoption or amendment of a zoning ordinance or local law and is not subject to an Opt-Out Agreement between the Village and the Cayuga County Planning Board; therefore this action may be subject to review by the Cayuga County Planning Board pursuant to General Municipal Law § 239-m(3)(ii); and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that

- 1. The Village Board hereby introduces Proposed Local Law #4 of 2021 in the form annexed hereto for consideration and adoption.
- 2. The Village Board hereby finds and determines that the within action is a Type "II" action and not reasonably anticipated to "affect the environment" pursuant to 6 NYCRR §617.5(c)(30) of SEQR, and thus is exempt from environmental review thereunder.
- 3. The proposed Local Law #4 of 2021 is hereby referred to the Cayuga County Planning Board for review pursuant to General Municipal Law §239(I-m).
- 4. The Village Board will conduct a Public Hearing via Zoom on October 28, 2021, at 6:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter can be heard, for the purpose of taking public comment on, and giving due consideration to, the enactment of proposed Local Law #4 of 2021.
