Cayuga County COVID-19 Situational Update as of 4:00pm

New Cases:

Monday, January 3, 2022 – 102 new cases

- 47 unvaccinated, 55 vaccinated

Active Cases in Mandatory Isolation: 602 Mandatory Isolation

Confirmed Cases – total since March 18, 2020:

There have been 12,202 cases of COVID-19 reported in Cayuga County.

Total hospitalized cases: 23 Cayuga County residents (13 of which are unvaccinated)

COVID-19 hospitalization reports received today from Crouse Hospital, Upstate University Hospital, St. Joseph's Health, and Auburn Community Hospital.

A Cayuga County resident, a male in his eighties, has tested positive for COVID-19 and has passed away. Out of respect for the privacy of the deceased and his family, we will not be releasing any further information.

There have been 116 total Cayuga County deaths related to COVID-19.

Additional Information:

There are hundreds of reported positive cases in Cayuga County waiting communication from our health department or the state case investigators (VCC). While we work with New York State Department of Health to come up with a solution please stay home when ill and seek medical care when necessary.

If you receive a positive test result for COVID-19 **PLEASE ISOLATE IMMEDIATELY**. Regardless of vaccination status, isolate yourself from others in your household. In New York State, isolation guidance continues to be 10 days from the positive test result or the onset of symptoms, whichever occurs first.

Positive test results from a health care provider, urgent care or laboratory may be submitted to your employer as proof of a positive test result if isolation orders from the Health Department have not yet been received.

If you tested positive for COVID-19 on an at-home test kit, please take a picture of the test. You must label with your name, date of birth, and test date. Please submit your result to the Cayuga County Health Department by calling 315-253-1560 and follow the prompts or submit by email to covidtest@cayugacounty.us.

If you test positive for COVID-19, we are asking that community members be responsible in preventing the spread of this illness by:

- Remaining at home and isolating from household members
- Notify people you have spent time with that you are positive for COVID-19 and tell them to monitor themselves for symptoms.

The community is being asked to take extra precautions and make responsible decisions. Please:

- Stay home if you do not feel well
- Keep your gatherings small and well ventilated
- Wear masks both indoors and outdoors when gathering with people who are not in your household
- Maintain six feet social distance from others.

COVID-19 Vaccination Clinics are held in the Event Center at the Fingerlakes Mall in the former Spirit Halloween store. Please enter through the back of the mall near the movie theaters. You will not be able to enter through the inside of the mall.

Thursday, January 6th from 4:00-6:00pm – Pfizer First and Second Doses and Boosters.

This clinic will be **appointment only** offer Pfizer first and second doses for (12 years of age and older) and Pfizer Boosters (16 years of age and older).

Saturday, January 8th 11:00am – 1:00pm Pfizer Pediatric First and Second Doses

This clinic will offer **appointments and walk-ins** Pfizer pediatric first and second doses for those ages 5 through 11 years-old.

You make your appointment by visiting our website www.cayugacounty.us/health .

These clinics are restricted to Cayuga County residents. Please bring your insurance card and if receiving a second dose or booster, your vaccine card.

The availability of the vaccine is not limited to just the health department. Individuals are encouraged to work with local pharmacies, federally qualified health centers, and healthcare providers to get an appointment.
