Total Hospitalized Cases: 8 Cayuga County residents

COVID-19 hospitalization reports received today from Crouse Hospital, Upstate University Hospital, St. Joseph's Health, and Auburn Community Hospital.

Deaths:

Two Cayuga County residents – both males in their eighties – have tested positive for COVID-19 and have passed away. Out of respect for the privacy of the deceased and their families, we will not be releasing any further information.

There have been 145 total reported Cayuga County deaths related to COVID-19.

Additional Information:
