Displays: The Patrick Tavern display, "Meet Benjamin Ledyard," which opened for New York State's "Path Through History Weekend," Oct. 7-8, continues. This exhibit and its companion at the Ledyard Town Hall, "Despite Remonstrance," will remain in place for the remainder of the year.

On the relationship between Lewis Henry Morgan and E. B. Morgan (fathers were cousins, second or more distant). On where the enslaved lived in Aurora (in the homes they served). On consistent designation of Landmark properties. On stonemasons who might have worked in both Aurora and Auburn (conversation with Seward House staff).

Planning: For event focused on farmer veterans, to take place Nov. 14. For Christmas in Aurora.
