Built in 1793, Patrick Tavern is the oldest extant building in Aurora, and the focus of ongoing preservation efforts by the Village of Aurora Historical Society and the Village of Aurora.

About the venue: Designed and built in 1899, the Tudor Revival building housing the Aurora Free Library is celebrating its 125th anniversary this year. It features ornately carved woodwork, leaded glass windows and a Victorian theater – the Morgan Opera House – on the second story.
