"The street [past Court St] was opened about 1854." Previous site of the Daniel Avery house, built as the Seth Phelps house prior to 1805. Then Jonathan Swan, then Dr. Elisha Leffingwell. Henry Wells, 1847, burned 1852 or 1853. "The place was soon after cut by a street and small houses put on either side," several moved from Main St. "The well by the roadside was part of the old house."
