The Aurora Swim Program began June 27th with a boathouse clean-up with Carolyn Connors, Christy VanArnum, and lifeguards Jake and Ian Gentry. Carolyn graciously helped show us the ropes and explain how things generally worked at The Dock. The raft and swim lines were installed 6/28 by Aaron, Christy and Elan (volunteer) VanArnum and Tony from DPW.

We were able to open on Monday July 1 and planned to stay open until August 18th. We never had a day where we could not open due to staffing issues. On the evening of our opening day, guards participated in emergency drills with AVFD.

Sat. August 17, 3 guards and Christy assisted with the AVFD Swim Across the Lake.

The Boathouse was cleaned Sunday 8/18, raft and lines will be brought in and all Village of Aurora gear will be moved to storage today 8/27.

\*We did observe that the majority of patrons came to The Dock in the later portion of open hours. When possible, the guards would stay open longer to accommodate swimmers who wanted to stay later. It may be worth trying more evening hours next year.
