

## **Village of Aurora Board of Trustees June 17, 2026 Regular Meeting Minutes**

The meeting was held at the Aurora Firehouse Meeting Room at 6:00 p.m.

(Following the meeting, it was clarified that drinking water taken directly from Cayuga Lake following treatment is not recommended. Treated, municipal water is safe to drink)

**Reports**

**Code Officer** (see attached): Officer Greer noted in his report that the Village should consider banning fireworks outright due to concerns with the last couple displays.

Trustee Balloni noted, that as the fire chief, he cannot sign off on any displays along the lake except for the former Wells College boathouse dock, because there is no access for fire apparatus.

Trustee Bianconi added that as a boat captain, it is mandatory for the coast guard to be notified for fireworks on the water, which did not happen with the last two “permitted’ displays.

**Historian** (see attached): Dr. Schwab reported on public celebrations, displays, queries, and a soon to be published article on Edward Paine of Paine’s Creek.

## **Old Business**

### **Water Updates**

**Wells Campus Water Meters:** Mr. Teter contacted Wells multiple times to set up a meeting on how best to proceed with updating the campus water meters. As of this meeting, a date has not been scheduled.

**WWTP Generator:** the request to FEMA for additional funds and an extended timeline to install a new generator at the wastewater treatment plant was approved. Also, the contractor agreed to hold his pricing for the project but cannot begin until the fall.

**NBRC Grant:** the next reimbursement from the Northern Border Regional Commission grant for the water plant filters will determine how much funding remains.

**Water Rates** (see attached): Mr. Teter presented an updated rate schedule based on the water readings received over the past year. Mr. Teter noted that any residence currently used as a commercial property will be charged the commercial rate. This includes support properties, short-term and long-term rentals, and buildings with at least two apartments. Additionally, any buildings designated as condemned/abandoned/uninhabitable will be charged 0.25 of the residential rate.

Mr. Teter further noted that Wells College will be charged for their water usage as their exemption under the lease agreement for the water plant became null and void once the plant was sold to the Village. Despite the closing of the campus, water usage is high per the readings of the current meters. Mr. Teter reiterated his eagerness to meet with Wells and move forward with updating the meters as it will only be to their benefit.

## **RESOLUTION #26-25: TO CHANGE WATER AND SEWER RATES IN THE VILLAGE OF AURORA**

**Moved:** Trustee Miller

**Second:** Trustee Balloni

**Date:** June 17, 2026

**WHEREAS:** the Village of Aurora was forced to operate and maintain the Wells water plant beginning October 1, 2024, due to the sudden closure of Wells College, announced April 29, 2024; and

**WHEREAS:** the annual cost of operating and maintaining the water plant and overall water system has been determined to be \$300,000.00; and

**WHEREAS:** revenue to operate the water plant and system must be received through water fees from all the users of the water; and

**WHEREAS:** the Village of Aurora also lost significant revenue in the sewer budget due to the closure of Wells College; and

**WHEREAS:** the annual cost of operating and maintaining the sewer treatment plant and system has been determined to be \$236,000; and

**WHEREAS:** revenue to operate the wastewater treatment plant and system must be received through sewer fees from all users of the sewer system; and

**WHEREAS:** the Village Board desires to continue a flat-fee approach for each category of user as this system allocates the fees in an equitable manner reflecting the actual volume of use by each category of user; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:** that the Village of Aurora will adopt a new rate structure for both water and sewer use as is described and noted on the attached "Rate Schedule

The question of the adoption of the foregoing resolution was duly put to a vote, the upon roll call, the vote was as follows

**Authorize the Mayor to Hire an Engineer:** Mayor Murphy requested authorization to hire Ani Fish, if inclined, following her interview.
